Politicians, historians and architects will discuss on Tuesday, 24 November in Berlin. Christoph Ingenhoven will make an architectural statement.

After years of fruitless debate, two futile parliamentary resolutions and an equally failed master plan of the Chamber of Deputies, there is finally a breakthrough by the initiative of Culture Minister Monika Grütters and the Budget Committee of the German Bundestag, with the decision to build a Museum of Modern Art at the Potsdamer Straße and to start an architectural and urban planning competition.
